It seems premature to predict major changes in the outlook for banking regulation over the next year when policymakers themselves have not yet decided what the past years events will mean in this area. Dealing with such certainty as we currently have, it does seem clear that the past years political events will bring forward an era in which banking regulation will be more varied, and potentially much less well coordinated, between major economies than the principal authors of the major post-crisis reforms in the United States and Europe had hoped. This presents a complex scenario for banks. For some banks it seems that just as the great structural reform agenda that emerged from the financial crisis has reached a conclusion, a new set of challenges has emerged that might in some ways be almost as profound as what went before.
